

# ARE YOU AWARE OF YOUR VA AID AND ASSISTANCE PROGRAM?



**THE VA AID AND ATTENDANCE PROGRAM PROVIDES FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR VETERANS AND THEIR SPOUSES TO HELP OFFSET THE COSTS OF ASSISTANCE WITH CERTAIN ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIVING (ADL), UP TO \$25,020 TAX-FREE.**

Our associates will be happy to assist you through the entire process, including identifying who you should contact and what information you should gather.



The eligibility and benefit level are based on the costs of any assistance a veteran or surviving spouse may need with any number of physician documented ADL, as well as some unreimbursed medical expenses.

While it can take a few months to finalize the process, your financial assistance will be paid retroactive to the 1st of the month following your application.



To qualify, the veteran must have been on active duty during wartime. The wartime service dates are:

WWII - December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946

Korean War - June 27, 1950 to January 31, 1955

Vietnam War - August 5, 1964 to May 7, 1975

Desert Shield/Desert Storm - August 2, 1990 to February 28, 1991



In order to apply, the following documentation is required for the veteran:

- Discharge Papers
- A letter from a physician stating:
  - Resident's medical history
  - Current medical conditions
  - Limitations, i.e. why the resident needs Assisted Living
- Proof of resident's net worth



For the spouse, the information above is required in addition to a marriage certificate and/or death certificate.
